Dear Families,

I encourage all families to continue this initiative and walk, skate and ride to school regularly in a safe way. Thanks to our Wellbeing Leader Stephanie Nightingale for organising this event and to the families and staff members who came along early on Friday to support this important community event.



New Sports Uniform Items at St Mark's - on behalf of our School Advisory Council, I am excited to announce that after extensive consultation with PSW Uniforms, we will be introducing new sports uniform items, which will be phased in over the 2025 school year. Our 2025 Preps will all wear the new items when they commence in 2025. All Gr1-6 students will have the 2025 school year to transition to the new items. In 2026, all St Mark's students will be wearing the new sports uniform items. Families of Gr1-6 students may choose to purchase the new uniform items to commence to 2025 school year, but this is not a requirement. PSW has advised that the new long and short sleeved Sports Polos will arrive on January 3rd and the new Sports Rugby Tops will arrive on January 10th.

The current Summer and Winter Uniforms remain unchanged.



To finalise all existing stock, PSW will be providing a 30% discount on the items below that are being phased out - long and short sleeved polo, bomber jacket and crew neck windcheater.



2024 Mercy Spirit Award - This award is presented annually to the student who most displays the Mercy Ethos of care, compassion and inclusion; a student who helps to make our school a better place by acting as Jesus' hands. The students and families of St Mark's were cared for by the Sisters of Mercy from 1934 until 1976. This annual award is presented in their honour to recognise all they have done for us.

The Mercy Spirit Award is a perpetual shield which is displayed in our school foyer. The recipient will also receive a gift voucher.

Details and a Nomination Form will soon be sent home with each child, and via SeeSaw and through our Skoolbag App. Please take the time to discuss with your children the qualities of a person who shows the Mercy Spirit and encourage them to nominate one other student. **Nominations close on Friday November 15th.**

Student Safety @ St Mark's - In the interests of child safety, please follow all Parking Signs in Argyle St, Lee St and surrounding streets at all times. It is very important that you drop students off in designated areas and do not stop in no standing zones or perform illegal U turns.

Please do not park and leave your car in the Drop Off/Pick Up Zones on both Argyle St & Lee St.

Council Parking Officers attend regularly and have issued several Parking Infringement Notices of late. It is also important that you do not park across the driveways of our neighbours.

Recently a number of families have been choosing to cross Argyle & Lee Sts by walking out between parked cars, which is extremely dangerous. Families are reminded to use the School Crossings to cross Argyle and Lee Sts. Not only is this a safe practice, it also is a great example to the children to teach them vitally important road safety skills.

As I mentioned at our recent Assembly, it is incumbent on all of us to make good choices to ensure the safety of our children when dropping off and picking up. Signs and restrictions can only do so much to ensure safety; it is the choices we make that really matter.

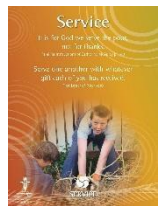
