2021 Curriculum Levies - I have been in discussion with our school accountants in recent days and am now in a position to announce that the school is offering each St Mark's family a credit to their outstanding Curriculum Levy balance, in light of the cancellation of many excursions, incursions, the P-2 Swimming Program and 5/6 Camp this year. This year we are offering a credit of \$150.00 per P-2 student, \$100.00 per 3/4 student and \$350.00 per 5/6 student **to those families who request it**. These figures are directly proportional to the Curriculum Levies collected for each level, minus money spent in the first half of the year and money required for the remainder of the year. Families are invited to fill in the form below and return it to the office via email **by Friday October 8**th – accounts@smfawkner.catholic.edu.au Statements will then be sent out to all families in early Term 4 **incorporating the credit to those families who have made a request**.

I encourage everyone to remain vigilant and to follow the Government and DHS guidelines we currently have in place. I am aware that there have been a number of exposure sites in the Fawkner area, and surrounding suburbs in recent days. If your child will not be returning to St Mark's in 2022 can you please inform me in writing as soon as possible.

Update on New COVID Restrictions - All staff and visitors to St Mark's are required to wear a face mask while onsite, unless there is an exemption. If for any reason you need to enter a school building while onsite, **you must sign in using our QR Code**, wear your face mask and continue to socially distance. We ask that parents minimise their time onsite and continue to sign in and out using our Passtab if there is a need to enter school buildings.

Gospel- Mk 9:30-37

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Mark

After leaving the mountain Jesus and his disciples made their way through Galilee; and he did not want anyone to know, because he was instructing his disciples; he was telling them, 'The Son of Man will be delivered into the hands of men; they will put him to death; and three days after he has been put to death he will rise again.' But they did not understand what he said and were afraid to ask him.

They came to Capernaum, and when he was in the house he asked them, 'What were you arguing about on the road?' They said nothing because they had been arguing which of them was the greatest. So he sat down, called the Twelve to him and said, 'If anyone wants to be first, he must make himself last of all and servant of all.' He then took a little child, set him in front of them, put his arms round him, and said to them, 'Anyone who welcomes one of these little children in my name, welcomes me; and anyone who welcomes me welcomes not me but the one who sent me.'


