**Update on the Wearing of Face Masks in Schools -** As outlined in a letter that was sent out to all families via SeeSaw and Skoolbag yesterday, the Department of Health recommends that all students over 8 years of age wear a face mask while indoors at school. This is an individual choice for all families and I ask you to strongly consider this recommendation, and when making your decision, I ask that you please keep in mind that wearing face masks has a twofold benefit in the prevention of the spread of infection; they protect the wearer from airborne disease, while at the same time preventing the wearer from spreading infection.

Families are asked to provide a face mask for their child/ren. Spare face masks will be made available at school for those that require them.

If your child is ill or has flu like symptoms, they must not attend school. They must remain home and seek medical advice.

Thank you for your ongoing commitment to keeping your children, the staff and all members of our community safe. Please contact me if you have any questions or concerns.

I encourage all families to consider setting up a Direct Debit to ensure that Fees and Levies are paid on a regular basis and can be paid off by early Term 4.

Families experiencing financial hardship are welcome to contact me so that we can explore confidential financial support arrangements.

The morning will commence with Open Classrooms at 10.00am followed by a special Assembly led by our Year 3/4s. Morning tea will follow at 11.00am in the Family Lounge. **Kids Matter @ St Mark's Action Team Meeting -** Thank you to those parents who came along last Friday to the KM@SMAT Meeting where we reviewed our Family Disco to make it even better next year and to plan the Trivia Night and Father's Day celebrations.

**Intentions for 2023** - It's hard to believe that we are currently in the process of preparing our class structures for 2023. To assist, we need to know if any students (other than Gr 6's) will be leaving St Mark's at the end of 2022. If your child will not be returning to St Mark's in 2023 can you please inform me in writing as soon as possible.

**2023 Prep Enrolments -** Please tell your friends that there are still places available for Prep 2023 at St Mark's. I am available for School Tours, which can be booked through the Office on 8335 4100.

Catholic Secondary College Enrolments - local Catholic Secondary Colleges take Year 7 enrolments during a student's Grade 5 year. I encourage families of current Grade 4 & 5 students to contact secondary colleges that they are considering for their child, in order to determine enrolment requirements and cut off dates. Yr 7 2024 enrolments (current Yr 5s) close on Friday August 19<sup>th</sup>, 2022.

**Rapid Antigen Testing** - The Victorian Government is providing up to three further deliveries of rapid antigen tests in Term 3 and again in Term 4 to schools. It is recommended that rapid antigen tests are used by students and staff when symptomatic.

Household contacts are required to test negative using a rapid antigen test on at least 5 out of 7 if they are attending or working at a school onsite. If staff or students receive a positive test result at any time, they must report this through the Department of Health system (Rapid antigen tests | Coronavirus Victoria) or via the coronavirus hotline at 1800 675 398.

Parents must also report a positive result to their school by phone or written notification; this is so the school can support them, record that they will be absent while in 7-day isolation, and let the rest of the school community know there has been a positive case onsite and that they should monitor for symptoms.

Students and staff who have tested positive for COVID-19, have completed their 7-day isolation period and are subsequently asymptomatic do not need to undertake surveillance testing for eight weeks.

As a community we continue to follow all the procedures and protocols of the Department of Health and Human Services (DHHS) and Melbourne Archdiocese Catholic Schools Ltd (MACS). #### **RELIGIOUS EDUCATION**

#### 17th Sunday in Ordinary Time

This Sunday our Church celebrates the 17<sup>th</sup> Sunday in Ordinary Time. In the Gospel we read about a time when Jesus' disciples noticed him praying. They asked Jesus to teach them to pray and Jesus gave the disciples a prayer we call "The Lord's Prayer."

17<sup>th</sup> Sunday of Ordinary Time

Gospel Reading: Lk 11:1-13

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Luke

Once Jesus was in a certain place praying, and when he had finished, one of his disciples said, 'Lord, teach us to pray, just as John taught his disciples.' He said to them, 'Say this when you pray:

"Father, may your name be held holy, your kingdom come; give us each day our daily bread, and forgive us our sins, for we ourselves forgive each one who is in debt to us. And do not put us to the test."



He also said to them, 'Suppose one of you has a friend and goes to him in the middle of the night to say, "My friend, lend me three loaves, because a friend of mine on his travels has just arrived at my house and I have nothing to offer him"; and the man answers from inside the house, "Do not bother me. The door is bolted now, and my children and I are in bed; I cannot get up to give it to you." I tell you, if the man does not get up and give it him for friendship's sake, persistence will be enough to make him get up and give his friend all he wants.

'So I say to you: Ask, and it will be given to you; search, and you will find; knock, and the door will be opened to you. For the one who asks always receives; the one who searches always finds; the one who knocks will always have the door opened to him. What father among you would hand his son a stone when he asked for bread? Or hand him a snake instead of a fish? Or hand him a scorpion if he asked for an egg? If you then, who are evil, know how to give your children what is good, how much more will the heavenly Father give the Holy Spirit to those who ask him!'



#### What is a bread bag?


Any bread bag or wraps pack (not limited to the Wonder brand)

#### What is a bread tag?

The plastic clip that seals the bread bag. Only plastic tags can be recycled.

#### How clean do the bags have to be?

Bread bags should be free from crumbs to ensure no contamination during the recycling process but they do not need to be washed.


