This Friday is the commencement of National Reconciliation Week. Semester 1 Reports & Student Led Learning Conferences – Semester 1 Reports will go home to all families on Friday June 17th. Rapid Antigen Testing – As advised, RATs will continue to be required by students who are household contacts, to attend school (five negative tests over a seven-day period) or who have symptoms. The ongoing supply of RATs to families in our school will ensure that parents have tests on hand should they need them if their child is a household contact or has symptoms.

Families must continue to notify the Department of Health and the school if their child returns a positive RAT result. Additionally, you should inform us if any of your children are household contacts.

For the foreseeable future some restrictions will remain in place to keep us all safe. Parents are required to keep their time onsite for pick up to an absolute minimum and must socially distance while onsite. If unable to socially distance, please wear a face mask. I will continue to keep families informed over coming weeks so that we can continue to work together to ensure the safety of our children and each other. Thank you for your continued patience, understanding and support.

As a community we continue to follow all the procedures and protocols of the Department of Health and Human Services (DHHS) and Melbourne Archdiocese Catholic Schools Ltd (MACS). Hello everyone,

This week has been a good week full of lots of learning.

Last Friday was Walk to School Day. The sport captains, school captains, and school action team members helped to serve everyone breakfast when they got to school. It was a really great morning!

We competed against Glenroy Private school for interschool sports on Friday. We have been continuing our inquiry learning about chemical change. We have been doing lots of experiments to learn about how and why

chemical change happens. We have investigated using different bases and acids and exploring what happens when we change variables in an experiment. Yesterday we did an experiment using skittles and water. We saw how the water caused the colouring of the skittles to dissolve into the water which made a colourful pattern effect. We are learning how to write scientific reports to make a hypothesis, record what happened and make a conclusion about the chemical change.

THREE RECYCLING REMINDERS

It's important that items being recycled are not contaminated with other products and are as clean as possible. Here's a quick checklist for you:

What is a bread bag?

Any bread bag or wraps pack (not limited to the Wonder brand)

What is a bread tag?

The plastic clip that seals the bread bag. Only plastic tags can be recycled.

How clean do the bags have to be?

Bread bags should be free from crumbs to ensure no contamination during the recycling process but they do not need to be washed.
