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# WEEK 6 TERM 3 NEWSLETTER Wednesday 18<sup>th</sup> August 2021

Dear Families,

Last Sunday, August the 15<sup>th</sup> was the Feast of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary when we celebrate Mary's heavenly birthday - the day that she was taken body and soul into heaven. The Assumption signals the end of Mary's earthly life and marks her return to heaven to be reunited with Jesus. On this day we give thanks and praise for the holy and blessed life of Mary, the Mother of Jesus. We celebrate how God has honoured Mary as the mother of all and welcomed her into heaven. At this time we also pray that Mother Mary will watch over and guide the people of Afghanistan during these devastating times and that the Australian Government will do everything within its power to provide protection and support. Hail Mary, full of grace!

As everyone is now aware, the Premier announced on Monday that the current lockdown has been extended until 11.59pm on Thursday September 2<sup>nd</sup>. This means that the remote learning processes we currently have in place will continue until the expected return to onsite learning on Friday September 3<sup>rd</sup>. We have received very positive feedback that the live lessons that each class has introduced in recent times have been warmly received by the students and families. As always, the wellbeing of all community members remains a high priority. I remain confident that remote learning in this way will not impact on the children's long term learning. Please contact your child's class teacher if you have any concerns for your child's wellbeing.

We are conscious that the cancelation of these events is very disappointing for the children and families involved. We will provide all details of alternative arrangements as soon as we are able. Thank you for your patience and understanding.

I encourage everyone to remain vigilant and to follow the Government and DHS guidelines we currently have in place. I am aware that there have been a number of exposure sites in the Fawkner area, and surrounding suburbs, in recent days. A full list of exposure sites and requirements can be found at - <u>https://www.coronavirus.vic.gov.au/exposure-sites</u> It's so important that we all do the right thing to keep each other safe and to enable the return to onsite learning as soon as possible.

**OSHC Update** – recently I received the news that our OSHC Co-ordinator, Tila Ofamooni is unwell and will be taking extended leave to recover. I also heard that Rita Strachan, the President of Youth Leadership Victoria is unwell. Tila and Rita are great supporters of the children and families of St Mark's and we wish them both a full and speedy recovery.

Late in Term 2 some parents approached me to determine the possibility of Youth Leadership Victoria hosting a Holiday Program at St Mark's during term holidays. I have had initial discussions with YLV, and can confirm that they would be able to offer this service in the future if there were a sufficient number of committed enrolments to make the program financially viable, and a program that would have enough children to make it a fun and engaging experience for all. Due to the uncertainty of the current times it will not be possible to offer a program in the upcoming September holidays. I will continue to liaise with YLV to determine the possibility of offering a program in 2022. In the meantime, families requiring holiday care are encouraged to visit the City of Moreland website to access their holiday programs. **Melbourne Archdiocese Catholic Schools School Improvement Surveys (MACSSIS)** – This year we are participating in the Melbourne Archdiocese Catholic Schools School Improvement Surveys (MACSSIS). MACSSIS is an annual process where we listen to the thoughts and feelings students, families and staff have about how our school can improve. These surveys help inform the ongoing improvement of schools across the Archdiocese of Melbourne.

MACSSIS data benefits everyone within our school and provides valuable community insights on areas that we can focus on. We believe it is important to encourage families to have a voice and contribute to shaping the ongoing improvement of the school.

The survey is only available online, can be accessed from Thursday October 7<sup>th</sup> and needs to be completed by Thursday October 28<sup>th</sup>. This survey may only be completed once.

For families where there may be more than one child attending our school, we ask that families **focus on the eldest child attending the school**. We invite all families to respond via this survey and participation is completely voluntary. There are no "right" or "wrong" answers – all responses are completely anonymous and at no point are any of the responses from students, families or staff identifiable by the school.

The survey is available in English, Arabic, Simplified and Traditional Chinese, Tagalog and Vietnamese. All details on how to access the survey will be shared with families soon.

**Intentions for 2022** – It's hard to believe that we are currently in the process of preparing our class structures for 2022. To assist, we need to know if any students (other than Gr 6's) will be leaving St Mark's at the end of 2021. If your child will not be returning to St Mark's in 2022 can you please inform me in writing as soon as possible.

**2022 Prep Enrolments** – Please tell your friends that there are still places available for Prep 2022 at St Mark's. I am available for School Tours, which can be booked through the Office on 8335 4100.

Catholic Secondary College Enrolments – local Catholic Secondary Colleges take Year 7 enrolments during a student's Grade 5 year. I encourage families of current Grade 4 & 5 students to contact secondary colleges that they are considering for their child, in order to determine enrolment requirements and cut off dates. Yr 7 2023 enrolments (current Yr 5s) close on Friday August 20<sup>th</sup>.

**Update on New COVID Restrictions** - All staff and visitors to St Mark's are required to wear a face mask while onsite, unless there is an exemption. If for any reason you need to enter a school building while onsite, **you must sign in using our QR Code**, wear your face mask and continue to socially distance. We ask that parents minimise their time onsite at drop off and pick up time, and also continue to sign in and out using our Passtab if there is a need to enter school buildings. When onsite learning returns, Drop Off & Pick Up arrangements will remain unchanged, with all students being dismissed at 3.30pm. Should you have any concerns relating to school operations, or the health and safety of students, please do not hesitate to contact me. Thank you for your patience, understanding and support.

As a community we continue to follow all the procedures and protocols of the Department of Health and Human Services (DHHS) and Melbourne Archdiocese Catholic Schools Ltd (MACS). Advice from the DHHS is that if a student or member of the community is unwell for any reason, **they should get tested and then remain at home until they receive their results.
