Intentions for 2023 - We are currently in the process of preparing our class structures for 2023. Student Safety - I ask parents to be particularly mindful at drop off and pick up time each day. I am aware that in the mornings some students alight from cars from the driver's side straight onto the road. This is a very dangerous practice as it could put children directly in the line of oncoming cars. Both Lee St and Argyle St are through roads that are used by members of the public each day. Unfortunately I often see cars travelling well above the 40KM School Zone limit along these streets. I ask parents to ensure that their children get out on the passenger side, straight onto the footpath. If students need to cross either Lee or Argyle Sts to enter the school they must use the Pedestrian Crossings provided. There are some students who are crossing Lee St by walking out from between stationary cars, which is a very dangerous practice.

SunSmart at St Mark's - In accordance with our SunSmart Policy at St Mark's, a reminder that school hats are to be worn by all students for all outside activities in Term 4. Students can choose to wear either the School Legionnaire's Hat or the Bucket Hat. Hats are available for purchase from PSW – 2/283 Rex Rd, Campbellfield, 9303 7845 or www.psw.com.au. Please ensure hats are labelled with your child's name.

COVID-19 Update - Please continue to remain vigilant about preventing COVID-19 transmission. Any student who is unwell should continue to remain at home. This helps to keep staff and students healthy and well in our school and reduces the spread of both COVID-19 and other respiratory diseases. Parents and carers will be contacted if their child shows symptoms while at school.

Students who wish to wear a mask should continue to do so. To keep our school as safe as possible, we will also continue to use air purifiers and other COVID-19 prevention measures.

RELIGIOUS EDUCATION

33rd Sunday in Ordinary Time

This Sunday, our Church celebrates the 33rd Sunday in Ordinary Time. In the Gospel, we read about a time when Jesus spoke to people who were facing difficult and challenging times. He made a promise and said, "I will give you a mouth (words) and wisdom".

That promise is with us today, through the guidance of The Holy Spirit. When we find ourselves in a difficult situation or troubling times, it is important that we listen for God's words and receive the wisdom necessary to make a good decision and to reach out to others when needed.

Gospel Reading: Lk 21:5-19

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Luke

When some were talking about the Temple, remarking how it was adorned with fine stonework and votive offerings, Jesus said, 'All these things you are staring at now – the time will come when not a single stone will be left on another: everything will be destroyed.' And they put to him this question: 'Master,' they said, 'when will this happen, then, and what sign will there be that this is about to take place?'

'Take care not to be deceived,' he said, 'because many will come using my name and saying, "I am he" and, "The time is near at hand." Refuse to join them. And when you hear of wars and revolutions, do not be frightened, for this is something that must happen but the end is not soon.' Then he said to them, 'Nation will fight against nation, and kingdom against kingdom. There will be great earthquakes and plagues and famines here and there; there will be fearful sights and great signs from heaven.

But before all this happens, men will seize you and persecute you; they will hand you over to the synagogues and to imprisonment, and bring you before kings and governors because of my name – and that will be your opportunity to bear witness. Keep this carefully in mind: you are not to prepare your defence, because I myself shall give you an eloquence and a wisdom that none of your opponents will be able to resist or contradict. You will be betrayed even by parents and brothers, relations and friends; and some of you will be put to death. You will be hated by all men on account of my name, but not a hair of your head will be lost. Your endurance will win you your lives.'

Our holiday group program focuses on:

- helping children recognise and expand their social skills through practising and exploring friendship options and choices;
- facilitating emotional self-expression, assertive communication, and confidence;
- providing fun, co-operative group experiences, with lots of sensorymotor and play activities for younger children, and discussion, coping strategies and problem-solving for older children.

They will be run *January 16th*, *17th*, *19th and 20th* for an hour each day for preschool and primary school-aged children.

Due to the complex mix of individual needs in our groups, we allocate children to groups based on their skills and age to ensure all children benefit from the program. You can anticipate that children up to the age of 8 will have a morning session and children over 8 will have an afternoon session. Exact start times will be announced after registration is closed and the group facilitators have grouped the children.

Places are available on a first-in, best-dressed basis, while also considering suitability determined via the pre-group session. We do maintain a waitlist after the groups have been filled in the event of cancellation/incompatibility.
