Dear Families,

Welcome to Week 7 everyone. On Friday at 7.00pm, a number of young members of our Parish will continue their Sacramental journey when they finally celebrate the Sacrament of Confirmation with Fr Colin Xavier. These Yr6 & Yr7 people will stand up and proudly renew their Baptismal Promises, they will be anointed with Chrism, receive the Holy Spirit and confirm their commitment to be faith filled people of God. Please keep them in your prayers. We wish them and their families well on their special day.

I am pleased to advise that I am now in a position to provide details of some of our end of year celebrations. Thank you for your patience as we have waited for guidelines as to what is possible this year. While families may not be able to be physically present at all of our end of year celebrations, we will ensure that we share these events with you as best we can. I encourage everyone to engage in the wonderful events that are to come in Term 4.

St Mark's Christmas Carols – Due to the current restrictions on public gatherings, our annual Christmas Carols will be a virtual event this year. We will be sending out a YouTube video link of our children singing Christmas Carols in Week 11 via SeeSaw and Skoolbag. Our Performing Arts Teacher, Ms Lara Beltrame and our Italian Teacher, Signora Donna Salera are busily preparing the children for this special event. More details of the event are included in this Newsletter. We pray that we will be able to gather together for our Christmas Carols and Family Picnic in 2022.

Gr 6 Graduation Mass – The Gr6 Graduation Mass will be held on Tuesday December 14th at 6.00pm in St Mark's Church. We are pleased that the parents of our Gr6 students, and siblings, will be able to attend this event. All adults attending will be required to be fully vaccinated and will need to provide their certificate prior to the event. The Graduation Mass will also be filmed and shared with the community after the event. More details will be provided to our Gr6 families in coming weeks.

Farewell Assembly – our Farewell Assembly will be held on Wednesday December 15th at 12.00pm in the School Hall. Parents of our Gr6 students will be able to attend this event. We will also invite the families of P-5 students who will be leaving St Mark's at the end of the year. All adults attending will be required to be fully vaccinated and will need to provide their certificate prior to the event.

Italian Day Celebration – We had a lovely day celebrating all things Italian last Friday while engaging in wonderful cultural events and activities. Many thanks to our LOTE Italian Teacher Signora Donna Salera for once again providing this memorable experience for the students of St Mark's. Grazie Signora Maestra!

2021 Mercy Spirit Award – This award is presented annually to the student who most displays the Mercy Ethos of care, compassion and inclusion; a student who helps to make our school a better place by acting as Jesus' hands. The students and families of St Mark's were cared for by the Sisters of Mercy from 1934 until 1976. This annual award is presented in their honour to recognise all they have done for us.

The Mercy Spirit Award is a perpetual shield which is displayed in our school foyer. The recipient will also receive a gift voucher.

Details and a Nomination Form have been sent home with each child, and via SeeSaw and through our Skoolbag App. Please take the time to discuss with your children the qualities of a person who shows the Mercy Spirit and encourage them to nominate one other student. **Nominations close on Friday November 19**th.

Weekly Assembly in Term 4 – Families are welcome to tune into our weekly Assembly via Google Meet each Friday afternoon at 2.30pm. The code for the meeting is – smfassembly.

Family members are asked to please "Mute" your microphone and turn off your Camera while attending the assembly. Our weekly Assembly will be hosted by our student leaders. Learners of the Week and Birthdays will be announced each week.

2022 School Fees & Curriculum Levies – In line with the recommendation of our School Education Board, for the third year in a row there will be no increase in School Fees in 2022. The cost of sending one child to St Mark's will remain at \$1,300.00 and the Family Fee for two or more children will remain at \$1,500.00. St Mark's Fees are amongst the cheapest of the Catholic Schools in the local area and we will continue to strive to provide an excellent education at an affordable price to the children and families of St Mark's. School Fees will increase in 2023.

There will be a slight increase in the 2022 Curriculum Levy for each child to cover an increase in costs of stationery, resources, excursions, incursions, IT equipment, etc. The Curriculum Levy for 2022 is as follows:

P-Gr2 - \$500.00 per child

Gr3-Gr4 - \$480.00 per child

Gr5-Gr6 - \$520.00 per child

As always, families will be able to utilise a variety of payment options for 2022 designed to minimise financial pressure on families. Please see me if you need to discuss payment of Fees and Levies.

Our School Development Fund will remain at \$150.00 per family in 2022. This fund goes towards playground and facility improvements and servicing of loans taken by the school as our contribution to the recent Building Program. I'm sure you will agree that this is a small amount to contribute to enable the continued development of wonderful facilities for our children.

Families with outstanding 2021 School Fees and Curriculm Levies are asked to finalise payments as soon as possible please. Please contact the Office to finalise payment.

Update on the wearing of Face Masks - All staff, Gr3-6 students and visitors to St Mark's are required to wear a face mask while onsite, unless there is an exemption. Parents of Gr3-6 students are required to provide labelled face mask/s for their own child/ren. It is recommended that parents provide a number of labelled face masks so that children have spares if required throughout the day.

The Chief Health Officer also recommends that Prep-Gr2 students wear a mask. Parents of Prep-Gr2 students please contact your child's teacher if you would like them to wear a face mask while at school.

SunSmart at St Mark's - In accordance with our SunSmart Policy at St Mark's, a reminder that school hats are to be worn by all students for all outside activities in Term 4. Students can choose to wear either the School Legionnaire's Hat or the Bucket Hat. Hats are available for purchase from PSW – 2/283 Rex Rd, Campbellfield, 9303 7845 or <u>www.psw.com.au</u>. Please ensure hats are labelled with your child's name. Grade 5/6 students will be permitted to wear their special Camp Cap for the remainder of the year.

Hats For Sale – There are a limited number of School Bucket Hats available for sale at the Office for \$13.00.

Summer Uniform – All students are to wear Summer Uniform in Term 4. Uniforms are available for purchase from PSW – 2/283 Rex Rd, Campbellfield, 9303 7845 or <u>www.psw.com.au</u>. Please ensure you label all items of clothing with your child's name.

For the foreseeable future many restrictions will remain in place at St Mark's. I will continue to keep families informed over coming weeks so that we can continue to work together to ensure the safety of our children and each other. Thank you for your continued patience, understanding and support.

I encourage everyone to remain vigilant and to follow the Government and DHS guidelines we currently have in place. It's so important that we all do the right thing to keep each other safe.

If for any reason parents need to enter a school building while onsite, **you must be fully vaccinated**, **sign in using our QR Code**, wear your face mask and continue to socially distance. We ask that parents minimise their time onsite and continue to sign in and out using our Passtab if there is a need to enter school buildings.

Should you have any concerns relating to school operations, or the health and safety of students, please do not hesitate to contact me. Thank you for your patience, understanding and support.

As a community we continue to follow all the procedures and protocols of the Department of Health and Human Services (DHHS) and Melbourne Archdiocese Catholic Schools Ltd (MACS). Advice from the DHHS is that if a student or member of the community is unwell for any reason, **they should get tested and then remain at home until they receive their results. Buongiorno a tutti / Hello to everyone!


