Dear Families.

Welcome to Week 9 everyone. Last Sunday marked the beginning of the liturgical season of Advent and our Gr5/6 students led us in a lovely Advent Liturgy on Friday. During the four weeks of Advent, we wait in joyful anticipation for the birth of Christ at Christmas. Amid the busyness of Christmas preparations we are challenged to consciously observe the holiness of the season in our everyday lives. I invite all of our community to join us each Friday in our Hall as our students lead us as we await the birth of Jesus at Christmas. The second Advent Liturgy will be led by our Gr1/2 students on Friday at 9.00am. All welcome!

Thank you to everyone who came along to assist with our fundraisers last Saturday. Also thanks to everyone who generously donated baked goods, drinks, napkins, sauce, etc. Your support is greatly appreciated. We raised around \$600.00 which will go towards our STEM Play Pod which will be installed in early 2023.

Over the past eight weeks we have welcomed our 2023 Preps and their families to St Mark's in a number of ways. The children have been coming in to get to know each other and to familiarise themselves with the school and the staff. The parents had an information session last week and tomorrow all families will attend a second meeting to learn all about St Mark's. It has been a joy to meet the children and to see their happy, smiling faces. We look forward to a wonderful partnership with our new Preps and their families.

Our Gr5 students are currently preparing to take over as the formal student leaders of St Mark's in 2023. As part of this process several of the students have submitted applications to be School Captain. It has been a pleasure to read their applications and their vision as student leaders. Staff will be voting this week and our 2023 Captains and Vice Captains will be announced at Assembly this coming Friday, December 2nd. They will be formally inducted at the Candle Ceremony on Wednesday December 7th at 2.30pm.

Christmas Carols - Families are invited to join us tomorrow at 2.00pm in the School Hall for our annual Christmas Carols. This is the first time we have been able to host the Christmas Carols since 2019 and the children are very excited. Each class will be singing two songs as well as Carols in Italian. Students are asked to bring along Christmas colours and outfits to change into. We look forward to a lovely celebration together to get us all into the festive spirit.

Semester 2 Student Reports & 2023 Student Assessments - Student Reports will go home to all families on Friday December 9th. These reports will provide you with a snapshot of your child, their achievements throughout Semester 2 and the many qualities that assist them in their learning. Congratulations to our students on their wonderful achievements throughout 2022 and many thanks to our dedicated teachers who have worked so hard in recent weeks in producing the reports. Included in the Report Package will be all details for the Assessment process at the beginning of the 2023 school year.

2022 School Fees & Curriculum Levies - Families with outstanding 2022 School Fees and Curriculm Levies are asked to finalise payments as soon as possible please. Please contact the Office to finalise payment.

2023 School Fees & Curriculum Levies - As families were advised in Term 3, School Fees will increase by \$100.00 per Family in 2023. This is the first increase in School Fees at St Mark's since 2019 in order to support families during the challenges of the COVID 19 pandemic.

This increase is necessary to meet the increasing costs of providing a quality education for the students of St Mark's. In 2023 the cost of sending one child to St Mark's will be \$1,400.00 and the Family Fee for two or more children will be \$1,600.00. St Mark's Fees are amongst the cheapest of the Catholic Schools in the local area and we will continue to strive to provide an excellent education at an affordable price to the children and families of St Mark's.

There will be a slight increase of \$20.00 per child on the 2023 Curriculum Levy. As always, families are able to utilise a variety of payment options for 2023 designed to minimise financial pressure on families.

Our School Development Fund will be \$200.00 per family in 2023. This fund goes towards playground and facility improvements and servicing of loans taken by the school as our contribution to our Building Programs. I'm sure you will agree that this is a small amount to contribute to enable the continued development of wonderful facilities for our children. A document containing all details, payment options and eligibility criteria to access Concessional School Fees is attached to this Newsletter.

Please contact me directly if you would like to discuss fees, levies or payment options.

Melbourne Archdiocese Catholic School (MACS) Concessional Fee Policy - Families are reminded that, in line with the MACS Concessional School Fee Policy, families can apply for concessional school fees if they meet the following eligibility criteria: of Aboriginal or Torres Strait Islander heritage; holding an HCC and eligible for CSEF; experiencing severe financial hardship; holding a DVA Gold Card; identified as refugees and holding an ImmiCard .

It is only necessary to reply once.* Please mark this date in your calendar. Through your generous actions volunteers enable rich learning to take place.

ACCOUNT NOTICE FOR 2023

November 2022

Dear Parents.

In consultation with the School Advisory Council and School Accountants, School Fees and Curriculum Levies have been set for 2023.

This is the first increase since 2019 as we understand the ever increasing financial pressures on families and strive to balance those pressures with the financial obligations of the school. Families who qualify for Concessional Fees are asked to contact the School Office for an application form. Concessional school fees are available to any family that meets the following eligibility criteria: a family of Aboriginal or Torres Strait Islander heritage; holding an HCC and eligible for CSEF; experiencing severe financial hardship; holding a DVA Gold Card; identified as refugees and holding an ImmiCard.

Curriculum Levy for 2023

Years P - 2: \$520.00 per student
Years 3 - 4: \$500.00 per student
Years 5 - 6: \$540.00 per student

School Fees for 2023

Family with one child: \$1,400.00 per family, per year Family with two or more children: \$1,600.00 per family, per year

School Development Fund

\$200 per family (Annual payment to fund school improvement initiatives)

Payment structure for 2023.

One invoice will be raised at the start of the 2023 school year.

Payment is to be made in 3 instalments – each instalment equal to one third of the combined fees, levies and building fund. Please round payments up.

Fee payment dates:

Term 1. Final payment date: End of Week 3 – Friday 10 February

Term 2. Final payment date: End of Week 3 - Friday 12 May

Term 3. Final payment date: End of Week 5 - Friday 4 August

Note: Fee payment dates do not apply to those families who have chosen to pay by Direct Debit

In addition to the above, parents are required to provide the following items per child: one art smock (can be an old over-sized shirt), one library bag - drawstring type (waterproof preferable) and a large box of tissues.

All books and stationery will be ready in the classroom for student use at the beginning of the 2023 school year.

Curriculum Levies account for recurrent curriculum expenses. Some examples of these costs are:

- classroom books and stationery;
- water awareness program for Years Prep to 2;
- sports and excursions hiring of venues, buses, entry fees, etc;
- inter-school sports for Years 5 and 6 (additional bus hire)
- · licenses, memberships and subscriptions;
- the upgrade of resources and curriculum requisites such as those needed for literacy, mathematics, library, science and technology, etc;
- · other recurrent curriculum expenses as arise from time to time.

We highly recommend Direct Debit for its convenience. Many of our families currently have Direct Debit plans in place. If you would like to take advantage of our Direct Debit facility, please collect a form at the office. Just nominate the \$ amount to be debited from your account and the payment frequency - i.e. weekly, fortnightly or monthly. We also ask you to nominate a start and end date. Once in place, amendments or adjustments can be made, but must be in writing.

Note: All accounts paid via Direct Debit (unless payments are ongoing) are to be finalised by 3 November 2023

School Development Fund - this is an annual payment of \$200.00 per family to assist with the funding of school improvement initiatives such as playground improvements and facility upgrades.

CSEF 2023 (Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund)

Families who hold a valid Centrelink Health Care Card or Pensioner Concession Card or Veterans Affairs Gold Card or temporary foster parents are eligible to apply for the Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund (CSEF) allowance of \$125 per child.

Note: If you applied in 2022, you do not need to complete an application form in 2023 unless there has been a change in your family circumstances. You only need to complete an application form if any of the following changes have occurred - new student enrolments - your child has started or changed schools this year or - changed family circumstances such as a change of custody, change of name, concession card number or new siblings commencing this year. All current recipients will be automatically assessed by Centrelink in 2023.

If you did not apply in 2022, please pick up an application form from the office or download the Application form from the website https://www.education.vic.gov.au/about/programs/Pages/csef.aspx

We ask that you please notify the office if you think you are eligible. Under strict regulations governing this fund, payment can only be credited towards the sports and excursions component of your Curriculum Levy thereby reducing the fee payable by eligible families.

If you are facing financial difficulty you are encouraged to make an appointment to see me as soon as possible to discuss mutually suitable payment arrangements.

RELIGIOUS EDUCATION

Season of Advent

This Sunday we celebrate the second Sunday of Advent.

In the Gospel, we read about a time when John the Baptist talked about preparing for the arrival of Jesus. John the Baptist came to tell the people about Jesus and he also baptized

them with water. His work and purpose was to prepare the people to receive Jesus who was to come with the power of God.

Jesus gives us the Spirit of Love, His Spirit which lives within us. In this Season of Advent, let's prepare the way for God's love to be in our lives through our words and actions.

Gospel Reading: Mt 3:1-12

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Matthew

In due course John the Baptist appeared; he preached in the wilderness of Judaea and this was his message: 'Repent, for the kingdom of heaven is close at hand.' This was the man the prophet Isaiah spoke of when he said:

A voice cries in the wilderness:

Prepare a way for the Lord,

make his paths straight.

This man John wore a garment made of camel-hair with a leather belt round his waist, and his food was locusts and wild honey. Then Jerusalem and all Judaea and the whole Jordan district made their way to him, and as they were baptised by him in the river Jordan they confessed their sins. But when he saw a number of Pharisees and Sadducees coming for baptism he said to them, 'Brood of vipers, who warned you to fly from the retribution that is coming? But if you are repentant, produce the appropriate fruit, and do not presume to tell yourselves, "We have Abraham for our father," because, I tell you, God can raise children for Abraham from these stones. Even now the axe is laid to the roots of the trees, so that any tree which fails to produce good fruit will be cut down and thrown on the fire.


